We are so excited to be getting you June's SLVRSTRK in June!







Bill said, "this is the step that separates the men from the bous." In my experience, I see it as a growth step. Having made an inventory of my resentments, fears, and sex conduct, now I have no choice but to look at mu character defects. If my perception changes, people, places and things change. It's easy to look at my history and not look too deeply before my character flaws are glaring off the page. I always chalked it up to my drinking and drugging, blaming everyone else for my conduct. But when I look at Step 6, I must look within.

We can all agree that selfishness, selfcenteredness (always looking out for me), and dishonesty are the grosser handicaps. How about fear - how does that fall into the mix of character defects? Well, in my case, I've always acted out of fear and survival to have my needs met. However, we are now on a different footing - our roots grasp a new soil. If we are to trust and rely on God (as we understand him) we shall look within.

So, how do we begin to examine our own fears? We must look at our actions, thoughts and feelings. If we have taken the steps to this point, we have swallowed certain truths about ourselves. We admitted we were powerless over alcohol, and that our lives have become unmanageable. Then we give light to the possibility that there is a Power greater than ourselves that can guide us to a better life. With this information, we have enough to make a decision, which enables us to launch into our personal inventory. "We turned back to the list, for it held the key to the future. We were prepared to look at it from an entirely different angle." Now we can pull our character defects from it.

So, in Step 6, when we see our character flaws, we become ready to have God remove them all. If our shortcomings are not lifted as alcohol was, we have to be willing and patient. It works; it really does.

TRADITION 6

AN AA GROUP OUGHT NEVER ENDORSE, FINANCE OR LEND THE AA NAME TO ANY RELATED FACILITY OR OUTSIDE ENTERPRISE LEST PROBLEMS OF MONEY, PROPERTY AND PRESTIGE DIVERT US FROM OUR PRIMARY PURPOSE.

At first this probably appears to be something that we need not be reminded about. In truth, however, many groups and clubhouses have found out the hard way how pertinent and important it remains!

Sadly we in recovery sometimes have difficulty setting aside our need for status and recognition. At times what starts as a true act of service turns into a display of ego. At that point this Tradition becomes a needed protection!

In early AA there was a group near Cleveland that wanted to build a recovery center as part of their group and to offer as a service to the community. endorse v. Tindo endorse v. Suppor advocate, suppor confirm, counten approval) on, set

Ultimately their efforts led to our now "rule 62 - Don't take yourself so dam seriously!" They ended up submitting 61 rules to GSO, but soon after wrote to propose the "rule 62." Apparently, they had decided that the potential ego-driven rewards of running a big facility were not worth the risk of tearing their group apart.

Many groups remind the members during the secretary announcements that while we may sign "proof of attendance" documents for the courts we are NOT affiliated with those courts. We keep that separation very clear, and that separation must extend to hospitals, recovery centers, sober-living homes and all other non-group functions.

If our primary purpose as a group is the carry the message to the alcoholic who still suffers it is essential that we don't lose sight of the man by focusing more on some perceived "mission!"






Our combined contributions from Individuals and Groups were slightly above our conservative budget expectations. We thank the fellowship for their support.


This is the 50th anniversary of the Gratitude Ball!





This committee brings information to new groups and to Districts offering suggestions of how to be of maximum service to the still suffering and newcomer alcoholics.


There exists a huge number of resources available through our General Service Office in New York, at the area level, our Area 42 and our Southern area SAGSC.


